## **ASH MAST HOOPS**



These mast hoops are steamed from carefully selected ash timber where the grain is best suited for the hoop, but with all natural products they are not controlled by the manufacturer nor retailer. We accept no responsibility for hoops breaking when fitting to mast. The customer must take all care not to over stress the mast hoop when fitting and should ensure that the hoop is wound onto the mast at the thinnest section of the spar and the the hoop is opened up in such a way that it is wound onto the spar perpendicular to the spar and not at right angle to the spar to minimise the amount the hoop needs to be strained. Hoops are supplied with copper boat nails and roves to allow the hoop to be fitted on the mast and riveted in place without removal of mast furniture, the stainless steel bolt is temporary to hold the hoop in place during manufacturing and transit and should be replaced. A small "anvil" should be made with a nipple of a suitable size for the rivet





head on the inside of the hoop, this anvil slides between the hoop and the mast and should have a soft back to avoid damage to the mast. Hoops have been

soaked in linseed oil on completion of manufacture, this is not a final finish, hoops will require more oil or vanish as chosen by the customer.
